

Ideas for Homework Matters Autumn 25

Remember that the great thing about Homework Matters is that you can present work in any way that works best for your child and your family. The main thing is to have fun and be as creative as you can. Here are some ideas for this term's suggestions in case you are struggling to get started:

My Environment Matters:

Build or make a peace garden model out of junk or lego. Be prepared to talk about why this garden is a peaceful place.

Draw a picture, make a video, or make a poster about all the places in your environment that you find peaceful.

Make a booklet about all the ways that you can help at school or home to make it even happier. Remember to draw lots of pictures and label with ideas. Or get Mum or Dad to write the labels for you.

My Faith Matters:

Attend a remembrance service or watch it on television. Draw a picture about what happened and tell us. How did it make you feel?

Draw a picture of your class Saint. Why do we remember them? Why was he special? Draw a picture or make a model and explain your ideas.

Other People Matter:

Think about some famous peace-makers from history or people alive today. Tell me about them. Examples of peacemakers could be: Gandhi, Mother Teresa, John Lennon.

Draw a picture of a police officer or a soldier. How do they help us? How do they keep the peace?

My World Matters:

Imagine you are King or Queen for a day. Create a picture of you as a King or Queen. What rules would you make to keep everyone safe and happy?

My Family Matters:

Think of all the things that members of your family do for you. Can you create a poster showing how they help you every day? Take photographs or draw pictures.

Think about your brother or sister. What lovely things do you share? What do you both argue about and can you think of ways to make things better again? Draw a picture of you and your sibling and write a sentence explaining how you make each other happy, and what you do if one of you is sad.
